


Revised Guidelines

Arunachal Disaster Management Authority, Government of Arunachal Pradesh, vide Circular No SEOC/DRR&DM/01 2011-12 date 15 May 2021 has issued several guidelines and instructions for strict implementation. Some of the major guidelines are:

 All shops and commercial establishments shall shut down at 2 pm on all days

- Cold storages and warehouses may continue after 2 pm
- All government offices shall function till 2 pm with 30% Group-C staff on roster basis
- All Group A & B officials shall attend office till 2 pm
- Movement of goods / persons related to commercial and private establishments providing essentials services / commodities shall continue to be allowed
- Marriages and funerals to be allowed with not more than 10 persons
- There shall be a total ban on movement of individuals from 3 pm to 5 am daily except for exemptions
- Auto Rickshaws, cycle rickshaws and taxis shall operate with limited passengers



Tripura

Extension of Lockdown

Office of the Chief Secretary, Government of Tripura issued directives which will be applicable across the state and shall come into force from 5 am of 20 May 2021 till 5 am of 26 May 2021. All inter-district movement of people and vehicles from one district to other district shall remain suspended during the mentioned period of time. Some activities like essential and emergency services shall remain exempted during the restriction period.

who have received two doses of vaccines can also carry the final vaccination certificates in place of the RT-PCR test reports. Those without any reports can have to undergo tests at the airport. All the three airports of state, Bilaspur, Raipur and Jagdalpur will follow the same directives. The same directives shall prevail for passengers travelling via rail and road. The circular has come into effect from 21 May 2021.


Relaxation of Travel

The Government of Chhattisgarh vide Circular dated 20 May 2021 has relaxed earlier guidelines of traveling into the state. RT-PCR tests are no longer mandatory for passengers travelling to Chhattisgarh by air, rail and road. Passengers are now allowed to carry negative RT-PCR reports 96 hours prior to travelling. Aditya Academy Group of Schools is providing free of cost services like portable oxygen, food for COVID-19 patients, COVID-19 essential kits, mobile




Yi Initiatives





'More children likely to be infected in third wave'

Experts call for setting up of paediatric task force to take necessary precautions

Rolkata, May 20 Patients gasping for breath, relatives desperately look-ing for hospital beds and oxygen cylinders - these are

some of the images that come to our mind when we

come to our mind when we think of the second wave of Covid-19 pandemic. Even as the country grapples with the steady spike in the number and severity of infections, senior severity of intections, senior paediatric experts and health consultants feel the third wave could turn seri-ous for children, unless in-frastructure is ramped up and adequate caution put in place in place.

Paediatric task force According to health experts, paediatric task force should be set up at the State and district-level to take neces-sary precautions so that the country does not cut a sorry face this time around. Citing some recent reports, Rupak Barua, CFO, AMRI Group and head of the CII subcommittee on health-care, said that more than 2,200 children under the 2,200 children under the age of five have died since the start of the pandemic globally. Brazil alone registered deaths of close to 832 children under the age of five since the start of the pandemic. pandemic.

First wave
The first wave saw those primarily in the age group of 55-60 years and above getting affected, and deaths were also reported more in this are group for people. this age group for people with co-morbidities. While in the second wavepeople in the age group of 30-50 have been getting affected more, there has also been a spurt in infection among chil-dren, though they have been mostly asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic so



far. Only 2-3 per cent of children below the age of 18 have been severely affected requiring hospitalisation so far: however, the situation might change if infections

might change if infections witness a spike.

"There has been an increase in infection among children in the second wave and given the fact that this and given the lact that this particular mutant is far more contagious, we feel that children might end up getting more affected in the third wave, particularly because there is no vaccination yet available for children," Vijayarathna Venkataraman, CEO, Motherbod Hespitals Irold Russell (1988).

nessLine. According to in-dustry experts, currently only around 5-10 per cent of only around 5-10 per cent of the total beds in a hospital is dedicated for children, since they usually do not re-quire hospitalisation and a majority of their treatment is done on outpatient basis.

The government should take immediate action and give clear guidelines to cre-ate paediatric infrastruc-ture across private and gov-ernment hospitals, said

Barua. Maharashtra has set up a naediatric nine-member paediatric task force while some of the

task force while some of the other States are also mulling this possibility. "We have got enough lessons from the second wave; there was a huge demand for critical care beds, ventilators and ECMO, and we could not provide all those because we were not ready a brother or provided. to handle so many critical care patients. It should not happen that there is sud-denly a demand (for medicines for children in third wave) and we are unable to


meet this," he said. Some of the existing Covid care centres, which have been escentres, which have been es-tablished in the second wave, can be ramped up by creating child-focussed fa-cilities to meet a sudden surge in numbers.

Watch out for symptoms


Though infected children usually do not develop any symptoms or are mildly symptomatic, some of them develop multi-system inflammatory syndrome (MIS-C), a rare but serious complication, associated with plication associated with Covid-19.


It is a condition where dif-It is a condition where dif-ferent body parts can be-come inflamed, including the heart, lungs, kidneys, brain, skin, eyes, or gastrointestinal organs. "Given that small towns

and villages are also getting affected now, we have to be wery careful and watch out whenever a child develops any symptoms," said Ab-hishek Poddar, Paediatric Interventionist, Gleneagles. Apollo


